## DONATIONS MOVING PATH PROJECT FORWARD

Tortuga Trail, SNAP's joint venture with ELDER Initiative will benefit from two recent donations. These include a generous contribution from Sunrise Territory Village HOA and a gift from Sunrise Presidio Townhomes HOA.

Their donations will be directed to the Tortuga (Spanish for turtle, SNAP's logo) Trail Project which aims to improve and re-establish a pedestrian walkway located on the north side of Territory Drive just east of Craycroft Road opposite the Lutheran Church of the Foothills. The pathway offers views of desert landscape and is accessible to nearby residential areas. Thanks to these and future donations, plus matching funds from SNAP, work will soon begin on Tortuga Trail's repair and improvement.
